Thanks to our generous supporters, we've had the greatest year of impact for our Scholars to date. We are grateful for and inspired by the partnership growth that makes it possible to support even more Scholars as they move to, through, and beyond college. Our growth reaches into all four of our key program elements:

Scholars have managed to complete over 60 hours of tutoring, increasing the overall Scholar GPA to 3.2 through Academic Enrichment. In Leadership Development, 30 Schmitt Scholars are researching communities for their spring impact projects. We hosted over 25 industry professionals as panelists and workshop volunteers to boost Career Exposure. Our College Access path successfully placed all of our 2020 graduating Scholars into competitive four-year colleges and universities, receiving a collective \$4.1 million in scholarships and grants.

A Response to the Global Pandemic and Racial Unrest

This year will forever be marked by COVID-19 and our nation's racial unrest. LINK Unlimited Scholars was founded during a similar period in the 1960s, in response to the death of Dr. King and subsequent racial tensions. We continue to serve and remain steadfast, eradicating barriers to economic opportunity through education for our Scholars and families.

Because 2020 led to many of us learning, working, and social distancing at home for months, the inequities present in Black communities created additional challenges for students already lacking access to resources and tools. Anicia is now a confident university freshman.

Before Anicia became a LINK Scholar, just the thought of raising her hand in class was terrifying. She preferred to keep quiet rather than draw attention to herself. But through the programming made possible by our donors, Anicia is no longer too shy to set herself apart. She shares, "Through programs such as Summer Learning, Schmitt Scholars, Personal Development Workshops, and Saturday Academy, LINK Unlimited has allowed me to find my voice and stand out in the crowd."

Anicia's confidence grew each year along with her academic accolades. At St. Ignatius College Prep, a 4.13 GPA earned her Honors with Distinction every semester and a place in the National Honor Society. "LINK Unlimited has instilled in me the value of strong leadership," Anicia explains, which is why she was chosen to participate in the exclusive Girls' Leadership Worldwide, a 10-day leadership program held at the Eleanor Roosevelt Center in Val-Kill, New York. Anicia's achievements are so impressive that she was accepted to an astounding 14 top universities, including Yale, Harvard, Princeton, Johns Hopkins, Emory, and Cornell. Harvard was Anicia's pick.

Throughout her four-year fellowship as a LINK Scholar, Anicia had the support of her Mentor, Duffy Lorenz. Anicia shares that "being paired with my Mentor, Mrs. Duffy Lorenz, has given me the opportunity to be exposed to a world of success, and I am able to envision myself as a future Mentor, giving back to my community."

For Black students in Chicago, the educational playing field is anything but eyes

One of Chicago's biggest challenges is an educational system that magnifies debilitating, lifelong gaps for Black students.

Children caught in these gaps are like all kids their age: full of energy and curiosity, full of dreams and potential. But the path to future success is not available without access to the resources and tools needed to navigate our merit-based school system.

When Black students are denied equal access to educational opportunities, our city is being denied future community leaders, business experts, out-of-the-box thinking entrepreneurs, and problem solvers. The devastating impact can be seen in low high school graduation rates and college acceptance and graduation rates. And if Black students somehow defy the odds by graduating from high school, getting accepted to college, and graduating from college? Their debt is crippling.

Black students are disproportionately impacted by systemic and structural forces that have impeded their ability to access opportunities, gain economic mobility, and become the community leaders our city needs.


The Problem




On average, it takes **25 years for Black college graduates** to pay back their college debt, as compared to just **10 years for White college graduates.**



Our Model

Our proven model identifies high-potential Black students for a **four-year high school fellowship** that gives them the resources and tools needed to access the path to success. Access to this path hinges on quality education, from middle school to high school to college. Our four-year fellowship model is highly effective and is **advanced through mentoring**. Each Scholar is paired with a Mentor who commits to four years of financial and developmental support. In addition, we offer a **two-year fellowship for middle school students** called Jr. LINK, designed to prepare them for the high school selection process.


Together with our donors, we provide programming that moves these outstanding Scholars to, through, and beyond college.



Our proven model is highly effective for changing the life trajectory of our Scholars and is advanced through mentoring. Each of our Scholars is paired with a Mentor who commits to four years of financial and developmental support. Mentors come from around the city of Chicago, representing a wide array of professional backgrounds and fields. Kathy Schumacher, who is a partner at McDermott Will & Emery LLP, has mentored LINK Scholar Noadiyah since 2016. She remembers what prompted her to commit to the four-year fellowship:

"Because of my father's death when I was six years old, I was brought up by my mother in a household of very limited means—so I know only too well the vital impact that my mentors had on my life. This was my chance to pay it forward."

Over the years, Kathy and Noadiyah have spent time together around the city, at school functions, and with each other's family. Kathy says, "I showed her my office where I work and described my path from college on scholarships and student aid, to law school and to being a partner in a nationally recognized law firm. I hope that seeing my journey and listening to my advice has been beneficial. I know that this experience has been rewarding from my perspective." This year, they've also had deeper discussions about the troubles in our nation and around the world.

Kathy's intent in becoming a Mentor was to pay it forward, but she is grateful the experience has been so personally rewarding was well:

"I am delighted to have gotten to know my mentee and plan to watch her as she embarks on the next chapter after high school graduation."

This is the powerful impact of LINK Unlimited Scholars: seeing and celebrating our Scholars as they successfully move to, through, and beyond college. Our Mentors support our Scholars on each step along the path toward success, helping them become everything they are capable of.

EXPAND SCHOLAR IMPACT


In the next 5 years, LINK Unlimited Scholars will increase our high school Scholar population to 600 students, increasing by cohorts of 50 students.
